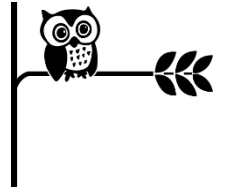

# How will KS1 SATS be assessed?

- 'Old' national curriculum levels (e.g. Level 1, 2, 3) were abolished in 2015.
- From 2016, test scores were reported as '**scaled scores**'.
- Your child will still be taught with the highest expectations and will cover all required elements of the curriculum, similar to previous years.
- The new curriculum is more rigorous and sets high expectations which all schools have had to work hard to meet.

# What are Scaled Scores?

What is meant by 'scaled scores'?

- 100 will always represent the 'national standard'.
- Each pupil's raw test score will be converted into a score on the scale, either at, above or below 100.
- A child who achieves the 'national standard' (a score of 100) will be judged to have demonstrated sufficient knowledge in the areas assessed by the tests.

# What will the children be tested on?

The tests will be completed within the month of May, children will take assessments in:

- Reading
- English grammar, punctuation and spelling (SPaG) – (Not compulsory)
- Maths.
- Writing within books will continue to be teacher assessed against the exemplar writing samples and guidelines. We will also be externally moderated.

# Reading

The Reading Test consists of two separate papers:

- Paper 1 – Contains a selection of shorter texts with questions about the text.
- Paper 2 – Contains a reading booklet of a selection of longer passages. Children will write their answers to questions about the passage in a separate booklet.
- The texts will cover a range of poetry, fiction and non-fiction.
- Questions are designed to assess the comprehension and understanding of a child's reading.
- Some questions are multiple choice or selected response, others require short answers and some require an extended response or explanation.

# Mathematics

Children will sit two tests: Paper 1 and Paper 2:

- Paper 1 is for arithmetic, lasting approximately 25 minutes and worth 25 marks. It covers calculation methods for all operations (+, -, x or ÷)
- Paper 2 covers problem solving, reasoning and mathematical fluency, lasts for approximately 35 minutes and is worth 35 marks.
- Pupils will still require calculation skills and questions will be varied including multiple choice, matching, true/false, completing a chart or table or drawing a shape. Some questions will also require children to show or explain their working out.

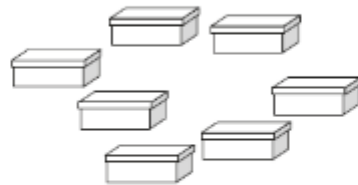
