Memody Music Service -

One of our friends, Tom Edney, a former Teaching Assistant at Oswald Road, has been raising funds for his new company, Memody, which has its roots here in school.

Memody is a music service that enhances the lives of children and young people by working with them to compose and record songs. Mr Edney told us more about this innovative and impactful project:



"In the three years I have been writing and recording music with children and young people, I have become increasingly aware of how sessions become more like collaborations than tuition. Directed by my

experience and skills, one Year 4 child showed me how to write a song that was under two minutes long; something I had been trying to do since I was about 17/18 years old... I'm now 33!

Children and young people teach experienced songwriters and musicians how to fall back in love with music and appreciate the novelty of creating a piece of music (something that can fade as you grow older, but so vital when writing a song). It is safe to say that I enjoy making music with children and young people just as much, if not more, than I do with my own peers and professional music collaborators."
