#### PUPILS BECOME EVACUEES ON STOCKPORT TRIP



I am passionate about refugees, and I recently volunteered at the camps in Calais. I also love sport- I played rugby for 25 years, and have just completed the Manchester 10k.


#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL PARENTS**

## You said We did

As part of our commitment to improving communication with our families, each newsletter will feature a 'You Said, We Did' section, so you can see how your suggestions have been put into practice...

You wanted us to develop further how we cater for Gifted and Talented children.

The Gifted and Talented (G&T) Lead has introduced 'Team Around the Child' meetings. This is an opportunity for relevant staff, children and their families to come together to look at put strategies in place to support you're each G&T child's continuing progress. So far the meetings have been a really positive experience where the children have been able to say how they feel about their subject and talk about how best we adults can help them to make even better progress.

You wanted quieter areas of the playground for children to access.

The old Owl Garden has been redesigned ready for work to be implemented shortly. We have also planned to develop the Chill Zone further. When done, this will allow for two quieter spaces for the children to access.

You wanted better timing, clarity and more appropriate use of different channels (eg. text, email).

Our new Communications Manager has introduced a Weekly Update email, which has streamlined communications.

You wanted a more mobile-friendly way to access information and updates from the school.

We have introduced a new app, which sends push notifications to your mobile whenever we add a new update or announcement.
