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Sample Hucklow Kit List

- A backpack/PE bag (to carry packed lunch and spare jumper/coat for trips)
- 1 x bath towel

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- Toiletry bag including toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, hairbrush etc.
- Night clothes
- Slippers or indoor shoes
- Socks and underwear
- 3 x t-shirts, shirts or blouses (at least 1 with long sleeves)
- Sweatshirt
- 1 x thick jumper
- 1 x light sweater
- 3 pairs of trousers and/or jeans and/or tracksuit bottoms clothes for the evening activities
- Waterproof jacket (and trousers if possible)
- Sturdy shoes and wellies
- 2 pairs of trainers, including one old pair
- Large plastic bag for dirty clothes
- Drinking water bottle
- Sun hat/cap and sun cream (to be applied by the child)
- Any medications are to be sent in a labelled sealable bag
