### **Trip to Longford Park**

Maths: This week we are learning all about time. We will be ordering the days of the week and months of the year and we will be learning to tell the time to the hour and half past.

Key vocab: o'clock, half past, minute, hour, second.

How you can support at home: Using analogue clocks help the children learn to tell the time to the hour and to half past the hour. They need to be able to read clocks at these times and write the hands on the clock to represent o'clock and half past.

English: Our book this week is 'Aliens Love Underpants'. We will be using it to write questions and come up with some exclamations. Who knows, we may even have our very own alien come to visit us in Year 1....hang on to your socks!

How you can support at home: An electronic version of the story is available at https:// www.youtube.com/watch?v=AGA9HjBubBU It's a very funny book and is great for prompting lots of imaginative talk. Try hot seating your child, where they pretend to be the alien and you ask them questions.

Phonics: We will be learning spelling rules while continuing to consolidate our phonic sounds. This week we will be practising reading and writing words that end with 'er' and 'est'

P5 sounds covered so far: ay, a-e, ou, ie, ea, e-e. ey, ie, i-e, y, ow, oe, o-e, ue, ew, aw, augh, au, ur, ir, ear, or, wh, ph, ou, oi, oy, ear, ere, air, are,

How you can support at home: When reading, make sure your child is confident with their sounds and tricky words as this will help with their fluency.
