The Hoot

Maths: This week we will be comparing lengths and heights. We will use non-standard units such as cubes, hands and straws to measure length and height. We will recognise that different non-standard units are more suitable for measuring the length and height of different objects.

Useful vocabulary: Long, short, longer, shorter, tall, small, taller, smaller etc. We will begin to recognise that this language will change depending on what type of length we are describing and comparing.

How you can support at home:

Practise comparing the lengths of different objects around the home.

English: This week we will be continuing to look at instructions. We will be looking at the layout of instructions and the commanding language used in instructions.

How you can support at home:

Look for examples of instructions around the home, e.g. recipes, craft instructions, instructions on how to use a toy.

Discuss words that may be used (eg. first, then, next and the importance of clear and correctly ordered instructions.)

Phonics: Mrs Craven's & Miss Millward's groups: Phase 5 sounds ere/ eer (here/there/cheer), ear (pear) are (square)

Miss Dyson's group: Phase 5 sounds ou (proud/group/mould), oi (soil) and oy (boy)

Miss Harman's group: Revision of Phase 2 sounds and blending practise. Miss Trundle's group: Application of Phase 3 sounds and blending practise.
