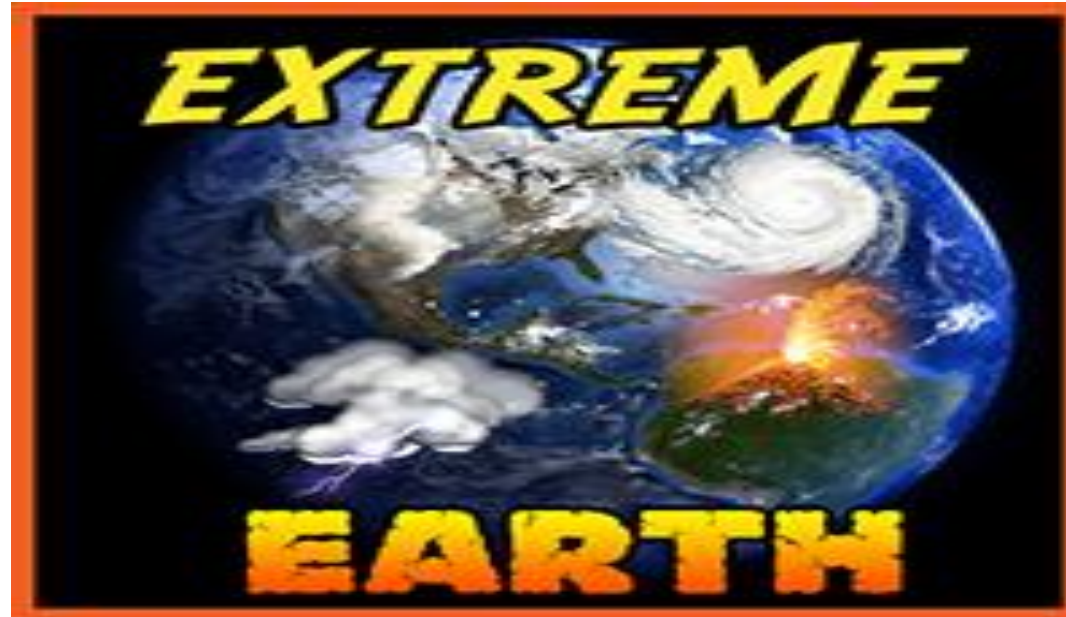
We will also be using atlases to locate deserts, the Artic/Antarctic circles and the Tropics of Cancer/Capricorn.
