Year 1 Wonderdome Planetarium Workshop

As part of our history topic next half term, which asks the question 'What should we build Neil Armstrong's rocket out of?', a mobile planetarium will be coming into school on **Monday 16th March**.

In our history topic we will be learning about Neil Armstrong and the moon landings. The planetarium will allow children to learn amazing facts about our solar system and beyond, including taking a flying visit to and learning information about our incredible neighbouring planets. Is it possible to live on them? And what makes Planet Earth so special that life thrives here? The children will also look closely at the moon, our nearest neighbour, and discover how important it is to life on Earth and why the moon appears to change shape. They will also find out what it is like to live on a spaceship and enjoy the experience of being weightless!
