Bodies

Watch this <u>BBC Bitesize video</u> about the different parts of the body, then draw a different body part on each side of the

dice. Point to and move whichever part you throw. Can you remember what it's called? Can you do a funny dance only using that body part?



Animals



Draw pictures of your favourite animals on each side of the dice. Can you pretend to be the animal that you roll? What noise do they make? You could even list all the facts you know about each animal:

Where do they live?
What do they eat?
Are they endangered?
Can they be kept as a pet?

Shapes

Do you know the name

for a 5, 20 or 100 sided shape? Write a shape name on each side of the dice and draw whichever you roll. Can you draw 3D shapes? Learn all about shapes at <u>BBC Teach</u> and find out how they can be used for different jobs!

Write different textures and descriptors on each side of the dice. Ask your child to find items that match this description e.g. soft, fluffy, rough.
