ECO TEAM UPDATE








CHRISTMAS DINNER

OPERATION OSCAR UPDATE



Operation Oscar has had a fantastic few months their total has topped £60k, which is amazing, and they are edging closer to their target of £65k...

We wanted to give a special mention to some of Oscar's friends from Year 2, who have been busy fundraising.

Simon Allan, his sister Caitlin, and Jack Gould are all running 20 miles in December, this is no mean feat in this cold and wet weather!

Marcus Leigh managed an amazing 4000 sit-ups in 20 days!!

Otis Murtagh showed off his spooky soccer skills on Halloween completing a 2 mile course whilst dressed as a frightening T-Rex...

Thank you so much to you all, you are all Operation Oscar Heroes, raising a phenomenal £1932 so far!!

We also want to mention the amazing support our local football club West Didsbury & Chorlton AFC have given- the committee, players, staff and fans have really taken Oscar and his campaign to heart, the club invited Oscar to be mascot at one of the games allowing us to have a collection on the day. There have also been a number of other fundraising activities with them- the players are doing a sponsored virtual run to Krombacher in Germany and back (a total of 2000 miles), the independent fans group Union 1908 have been selling desk calendars for Oscar, and a further group completed a 30 mile sponsored walk on Saturday 5th December, taking six South and East Manchester NWCFL club grounds. So far the combined efforts of all involved has raised a massive £6k.

As a reminder, Oscar was born 13 weeks early and suffered a bleed on the brain which has resulted in him having Cerebral Palsy. His condition has affected his lower limbs, meaning he uses a wheelchair.

A life changing operation called SDR (Selective Dorsal Rhizotomy) could give him a better chance of leading an independent life. Unfortunately, this operation isn't funded by the NHS and isn't covered by medical insurance.
