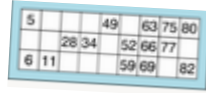


Bingo!

An Early Years and Primary curriculum-based activity sheet for the whole family

Traditional Bingo

Bingo is a game where a number, between 1 and 90, is chosen at random by the 'bingo caller'. Players each have a 'bingo card' containing a selection of those numbers and are ready to mark them off as they are called out by the bingo caller. The idea is to be the first person to mark off a line of numbers, or all the numbers, which is called 'Full House'! Bingo is often played at a very fast pace, so you have to listen carefully for your numbers to be called!

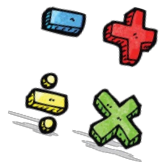

Maths Bingo

Why not combine a game of bingo with practicing your maths!



Instead of calling out numbers, you call out a calculation and the players mark off the correct answer.

This is a great spelling song. You can change the characters in the song, and the beat, to learn how to spell different names!

Did you know... the numbers in bingo each have a different nickname! Number 8 is 'garden gate', and 90 is 'top of the shop'! Ask your family if they know any more bingo lingo.

Real Life Shape Bingo

Why not try a game of bingo where you call out shape names rather than numbers. Once a shape is called, mark it off on your sheet and then try and find something in your house that is the same shape! Shapes are all around us!

Bingo can be traced back to the 16th century, and has also been called Lotto and Beano! Speak to your family members about games they played in their childhood. Do people still play them now? Do they have the same name?

Organise a weekly games night and take turns to teach each other a new game.

You could even use words that you may be learning to spell, with the caller saying the meaning instead of the word! How creative can you be?

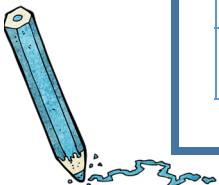

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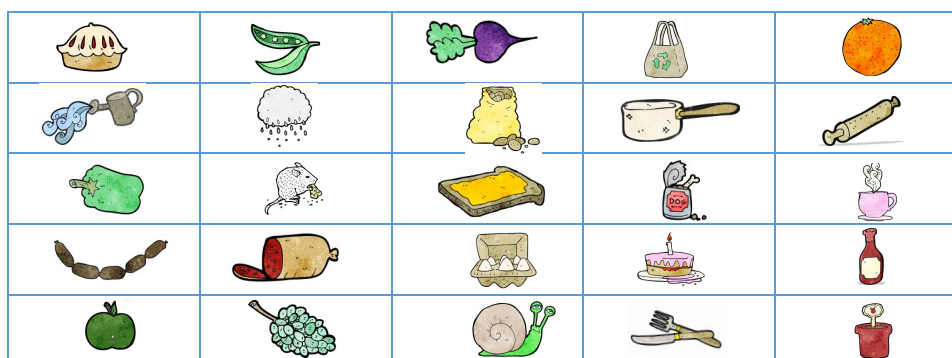
