What am I?

Get one member of the family to put a range of everyday objects into a bag or pillowcase.

Take it in turns to wear a blindfold and put your hand into the bag or pillowcase. Can you guess what the object is?

While you are guessing, use words to describe the object. E.g. smooth, cold, rough, prickly, soft etc.


Fingerprints

Take your own fingerprints, then do them for the rest of the family. You could use one of the following methods:

1. Dust flour or talc over your fingertips, then press on to the sticky side of a piece of tape. Stick the tape to a piece of dark coloured paper or card to see all the lines and ridges of your fingerprint pattern.
2. Knead some dough until it is pliable and then press your fingertip into it.
3. Dip your fingertip into ink before quickly pressing onto a clean piece of paper. This will stain your finger!
