Informing and Involving Inspiration!

We know that many of you are beginning to think about Step 5 (Informing and Involving) in your Eco-Schools Green Flag applications, this is one of our most 'holistic' steps! Step 5 naturally begins before an Eco-Committee has been formed and displaying a, recently-achieved, Eco-Schools Green Flag essentially informs your wider community that your school is actively involved in protecting our planet. The half-term homework linked to above, is a perfect way of involving families in Eco-Schools work and the idea is also very easily adapted... you might use your school e-newsletter to share weekly plant-based recipes, energy saving-tips or you could even set weekly challenges like creating bird feeders. This is a really simple way of informing your wider community about everyday environmental actions they can take, whilst also involving them in your Eco-Schools work!
