- Spanish will be taught in Key Stage 2.
- Spanish will be taught to all classes by a degree-qualified specialist teacher using the LCP Primary Spanish Scheme of Work.
- Spanish to be taught weekly, for 30 minutes.
- Spanish working wall to be visible in all classrooms to support with retention and progression.
- To show that progression is being made across KS2, evidence will be recorded via Seesaw in the form of both audio and video recordings. All other evidence including worksheets and written work will be kept in a folder that will move up with the child from Year 3. There is an expectation that proofreading for grammar, punctuation and spelling will happen whenever children produce written pieces of work. All written work and work recorded on seesaw to be dated with the Topic and Learning Objective visible.

The focus will be to develop the following:

- Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding
- Engage in conversations, ask and answer questions, express opinions and respond to those of others, and seek clarification and help
- Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing
- Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through using a dictionary
- Write phrases from memory, and adapt these to create new sentences, expressing their ideas clearly
- Describe people, places, things and actions in speech and in writing
