Dear Parents/Carers,

Year 6 Trip to People's History Museum

As part of our topic about the Suffragettes, we will be visiting the People's History Museum. The children will have an opportunity to research protest art and understand the significance it had for the Suffragette movement. They will also have a chance to explore the museum and the other exhibitions.

Each class is visiting the museum on different days:

- 6B will be visiting on the 24th April (leaving at 9am returning at approximately 1pm)
- 6A will be visiting on the 29th April (leaving at 9am returning at approximately 1pm)
- 6C will be visiting on the 2nd May (leaving at 12pm and returning at approximately 3:30pm)

6A and B will travel via tram. 6C will travel via coach.

Please be aware that **6C** will be returning to school **after the end of the school day.**

Please ensure your child is wearing sensible shoes and a waterproof coat. School jumpers or polo shirts are to be worn for the visit. If a child arrives on a school trip without their school jumper, appropriate clothing to assist in immediate identification of any pupil attending a trip will be provided.

A contribution of **£6.50** to help cover the costs would be appreciated. If we do not receive sufficient contributions, the trip may have to be cancelled. This contribution can be made via Parent Pay. If your child is eligible for Pupil Premium, you are entitled to the trip being funded by school.

Please provide your child with a packed lunch for the trip. All children who are eligible for free school meals can be provided with a school packed lunch if they would like one, alternatively they may bring their own lunch from home. Please make sure your child's lunch is in a rucksack or other bag, which they can carry around with them for the whole day.
