Flexible grouping

We are continuing to encourage daily reading and we will be sending home book banded books where appropriate. All children will have a chance to borrow the Year 5 “40 books” and respond via a reading journal.

There is an expectation that children practice their times tables via TT Rockstars.

Each year group has a homework task grid– the activities are designed to be screen-free and to enhance the children's learning within school as well as their social and emotional well being. We encourage the children to engage in the activities throughout the term – evidencing them however they see fit (on paper or via SeeSaw).
