Flexible grouping

This year we are continuing with our flexible grouping approach to learning. This should minimise the amount of children moving classrooms but maximise support available during lessons. We endeavour to ensure that all children are with their class teacher for the majority of the day – so as a year group, we only flexibly group for Maths lessons. Year 6 will meet regularly to discuss groupings and progress.

In Spring, we will be visiting The Imperial War Museum linked to our topic on World War 1.

In Summer, we will visit The Pankhurst Centre linked to our work on The Suffragettes topic.

We will also have an ice cream van visit after SATs. We also hope to have a "fun surprise" experience at the end of the year.

Homework

Homework at Oswald Road remains optional but we advise grown ups encourage participation. It forms a vital part of transition support and prepares the Year 6 cohort for High School.

We are continuing to encourage daily reading and we will be sending home book banded books where appropriate. All children will have a chance to borrow the Year 6 "40 books" and respond via a reading journal.

There is an expectation that children practice their times tables via TT Rockstars.

Each year group has a homework task grid—the activities are designed to be screen-free and to enhance the children's learning within school as well as their social and emotional well being.
