





Year 2 – 3: Autumn & Winter Home Activity Learning Grid


Choose one activity each week


Maths – Conker Tables  Collect 20 conkers (or coins/buttons). Put them into groups of 2, 5 or 10. Write the matching times table facts (e.g. 5 groups of 2 = 10).


History – Family Time Capsule  Draw or write about your favourite toy, food and hobby right now. Put it in a box to open in a year's time.


Wellbeing – Winter Warmth  Draw or list 5 things that make you feel warm, happy and safe in winter. Share them with your family.


Reading – Winter Poem  Read a short winter poem (or ask an adult to read one). Can you spot any rhyming words? Write your own 2 rhyming lines.


Reading – Cosy Corner  Snuggle under a blanket and read to an adult. Afterwards, tell them your favourite part and why.


Art – Frosty Window Prints  Use white paint or chalk to make frosty patterns on dark paper. Add glitter for a sparkly winter effect.


Maths – Hot Chocolate Tables  Draw 4 mugs. On each one, write a times table (2, 5, 10, 3). Fill them with marshmallow-shaped answers.

Geography – Weather Watcher  Keep a 3-day weather diary. Draw symbols for sunny, rainy or snowy weather and write the temperature if you can.


Maths – Winter Shopkeeper  Make a shop with 2p, 5p and 10p items. Use times tables

Maths – Times Table Hop  Write numbers from the 3× table on pieces of paper. Spread them out and jump on the correct answer when someone calls a question.

Geography – Map My Walk  Go on a walk and draw a simple map of your route. Add symbols for trees, houses or shops you saw.

Science – Melting Ice  Freeze some water in a cup. Predict how long it will take to melt indoors. Check and record what happens.

Art – Nature Collage  Collect autumn leaves, twigs and seeds. Use them to make a collage picture of an animal.

Wellbeing – Gratitude Garland  Write or draw 5 things you are thankful for on paper

History – Old Toys 🧸 Ask a grown-up about their favourite childhood toy. Draw it and write 3 sentences comparing it to one of your toys.

DT – Winter Shelter 🏠 Use Lego, blocks or recycled boxes to design and build a shelter to keep a toy safe from rain or snow.

to work out the cost if someone buys 2, 3 or 4 strips. Link them together to make a paper chain.

Reading – Winter Story Time 📖 Make up your own winter story. Tell it to an adult or sibling – can they guess the ending?

Science – Winter Animals 🦊 Find out (by asking adults or books) how hedgehogs, squirrels or birds survive in winter. Draw one and label its adaptations.
