"In English when we are putting the story into our own words. We learn a subject, get to know it, and then we focus on something, like semicolons, and then we have to plant them into our work."

"The teachers always help you but then leave you to do your own thing, like with writing in English. They can always help you to make it better but they let you get on with it independently until you do ask for help."
