RESPECTFUL



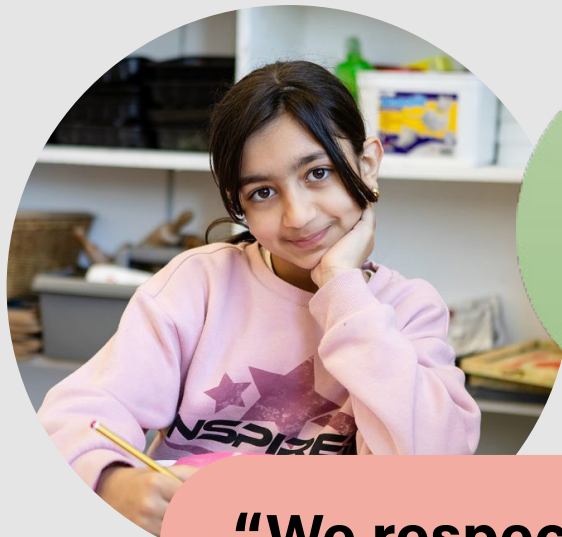
"When we go on school trips we're all sensible, so we are being respectful of the people around us by being quiet. Also we are a Rights Respecting school, which means that we treat everyone equally and respect everyone and listen to everyone's rights."

"We hold the door open for the next person. We show respect by using manners, like always saying please and thank you."

"We don't shout out and make the teachers upset. We show respect to other children by not being mean to others, and saying hello because it makes them feel wanted and included. We're a very welcoming school."

"The staff make sure the children are always happy, they listen to everyone's opinions and respect them and always give us a chance, even if we don't do as well as we could have, the teachers encourage us and respect us."

We asked the children what they do at school that makes them feel...

"We respect everyone and let everyone play. If you're sitting next to someone we talk to them nicely. In the playground if someone is left out everyone lets everyone play with each other."

"There's someone always offering to help you with anything, and when you find it hard, someone will always be there to comfort you. We're also a Rights Respecting school, so our school will always respect everybody's rights. If someone is not having a good day, or needs some help, they can go to the regulation station and there will be something that can help them."

"Usually if I see litter on the floor I pick it up. If someone is hurt, I'll take them to first aid. If someone is sad I ask them if they're ok."

"When someone is speaking we don't speak over them, we put up our hand and wait for our turn. We are a Rights Respecting school so we know not to judge people because of their religion, or what language they speak, or where they come from."
